## **Girls Varsity Swim**

Congratulations to our girls varsity swim and dive team which captured the All-High title on Friday. Keara Cotter doubled with wins in the 200-yard and 500-yard freestyle events, and CHS took first place in all 12 events, nine individual and three relays. Altogether City Honors collected 221 points with the 12 golds, six silvers and four bronzes. Other CHS first-place finishes were by: Makaila Hall (100 freestyle), Ava Whitley-Grassi (50 free), Kerrington Clouser (100 backstroke), Grace Rivera (200 individual medley), Amelia Colder (100 butterfly) and Andrea Merzianu (1-meter diving). #### **BPS Indoor Sport Spectator Procedures Amended**

The Buffalo Public Schools will now authorize parent and family spectators ONLY for remaining volleyball events. All students attending the contest must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Any student who arrives without a parent or guardian will be denied entry. Temperature checks, the completion of a health questionnaire, masking, and social distancing will be required at all District indoor athletic events. Upon admission, all safety protocols must be strictly adhered to by the spectators pursuant to this policy and the Buffalo Athletics COVID safety plan. If a spectator is not

# **Reporting COVID Cases in Your Household**

Please email news of any COVID cases in your household to Ms. McDow, assistant principal, and Nurse Cammarata. These staff members are managing our COVID safety initiatives and response. As we move indoors more and more due to the cold weather, the COVID virus has a greater opportunity to jump from person to person. We are emphasizing good safety practices with our students including distancing, proper mask wearing and hygiene. Please stress these practices with your child at home and with family members. We strongly encourage anyone in your household approved by your family doctor and eligible to receive the flu and COVID vaccines to receive them as soon as possible, if they have not already. These steps will help to keep our students and staff in school where they need to be!

# **Food Deliveries**

For the safety of all in our school building, parents and students are asked not to send food deliveries to the school. These deliveries will be turned away. Free breakfast and lunch is provided to all of our students at the school.

# **Student Support Days**

As a part of our continued efforts to support good mental health awareness and well-being among our students, the CHS Student Support Team will be utilizing a monthly class period for students to focus on these issues and recenter themselves amidst the hustle and bustle of being an adolescent. The first of these sessions will be held the first week in November 5 during social studies classes. All

grades will be participating. We will be rotating subjects each month to ensure one area is not giving up their teaching time repeatedly. Our theme for the Fall is self-care. We will be providing social studies teachers with a short video and activities. We realize self-care looks different for everyone, but the goal is to have a calm environment where students can take time and reflect on the importance of self-care.

#### Halloween

As is our tradition at CHS, students are permitted to wear a costume to school on October 29 with some very important boundaries. If we are to continue this tradition, it is important that students and families are respectful of these boundaries.

- -All costumes must comply with the school district's code of conduct.
- -No masks may be worn with the exception of masks designed for COVID saftey. No mask may cover the entire face.
- -No fake blood, no real blood, nothing too scarry or unpleasant. No fake weapons, no real weapons.
- -Nothing too serious. Keep it fun and creative but appropriate to a school setting. Make a teacher or classmate smile!

#### **COVID Testing**

30% of staff and students at CHS will continue to be randomly tested for COVID each month pursuant to current district procedures. This year, CHS will conduct the more accurate and less

invasive 24- hour turnaround mandatory Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) testing for COVID-19. **We encourage all staff and students to participate in testing in order to reduce the number of times individuals will need to be tested.** Families are asked to <u>use this link</u> to provide consent to include their child in the pool of students to be tested.

Families should complete the daily health screener once again each day BEFORE their child leaves for school. This link will take you to this year's screener. Families are encouraged to paste the link into the 'reminder' app on their smart phone to alert you each morning.
