Regents Exams

Regents exams have been given in New York State since 1865. These exams are a recognized national standard and open doors for New York State students when it comes to college admissions and merit-based scholarships. Our teachers and students have worked hard all year. **We are now ready and prepared to welcome our students for the first June Regents examinations in almost two years!** Families can find an FAQ about this year's Regents exams at this link. Remember, if your child is not satisfied with their exam score, they can request that the score be replaced with an "E" on their transcript after the exam- there is no penalty for giving their best effort!

CHS Device and School Materials Collection Process- June 2021

In preparation for the 2021-2022 school year, the Instructional Technology Department will need to collect, refurbish, and update all hotspots, student laptops and iPads and any accessories (charging cords, keyboards and/or cases.) This is required whether students have returned to campus or remained fully virtual. It is critical that IT has time and opportunity to service each device in order to make sure they are operational for September. Devices that have not been reconfigured will not work with updated systems in the fall.

Students enrolled in summer school will keep their assigned devices until the end of the summer school program.

Laptop and charger collection, with the support of District IT, will take place on two separate dates at City Honors School scheduled by the district* Families are asked to find

appropriate street parking, and do not enter the staff parking lot. The IT department will be sending a letter to each household to communicate this information to families as well.

*Parents, please make sure, prior to arrival, that the student's grade, 900#, and Last, First Name are on the laptop or hotspot with a label or piece of masking tape.

We have ALSO aligned our collection of any other books or other District materials from this year OR LAST YEAR not yet turned in on these dates! If your child is an in-person learner, they should turn in their texts/materials to their teachers directly. Here are the dates:

Monday, June 21, 8:15 AM - 3:00 PM

Grade 9-12 – (NOTE! All Grade 12 materials, uniform returns and debts must be collected prior to graduation!)

- -Laptop and charger collection will be down the hall in either Room 117 (LGI) or 116 (Health Room).
- -Yearbook pick up will be in hallway, then exit out the Blue Stairs to the parking lot.



CHS Juneteenth Celebration

The City Honors Multicultural Club would like to invite all to our upcoming event, the Juneteenth

Cookout on June 17th at 3:00pm on Fosdick Field. This is the first time that we have ever had this holiday officially recognized in New York State. We invite everyone to come to the Juneteenth picnic where we will celebrate freedom, enjoy the company of friends and family, and lots of food!

Juneteenth, also known as Emancipation Day, is the African-American celebration that marks the end of the long practice of human trafficking and slavery in the United States. Toni Morrison, the first black woman to win the Nobel Prize, noted in her research that it is estimated over 60 million or more enslaved Africans died during the transatlantic slave trade. While the Emancipation Proclamation was signed in 1863, enslaved Africans in Texas didn't get the news until 1865 when Union soldiers arrived in Galveston, TX. While the practice of slavery ended, Black people continue to face mass incarceration, redlining, segregation, and other forms of oppression in our society. While there is still more work to be done, we also deserve joy, liberation and freedom. That's why we celebrate Juneteenth!
