Note: City Honors Diploma requirements exceed the NY State minimum graduation requirements. Successful completion of our program includes at least 22 credits, with English, Social Studies, Science, and Mathematics taken EACH year in grades 9-12, regardless of the number of credits earned. You MUST have 2 physical education credits, 1 credit in art or music, and a **HALF credit for health in order to graduate.

In making your choices you should carefully consider your interests and abilities as well as City Honors graduation requirements.**

Please review the course selection grid with your child, sign it and have it returned to the School Counselor office. All CHS students work towards a Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation. Each student is expected to register for six subjects each semester, excluding science labs and physical education. Extensive collegiate level offerings are a part of our AP and IB programs and service and internship experiences are a part of our IB Diploma Program CAS and our Senior Service Learning Initiative.

Advanced Placement Courses

Advanced Placement courses are taken by all City Honors students as part of our program. Advanced Placement courses are challenging and stimulating classes, which involve significantly more time, commitment and work than traditional high school courses. These courses also give greater opportunity for individual progress and accomplishment as well as exploring subjects in greater depth. More than 3,200 colleges and universities offer credit and/or advanced placement for qualifying AP scores and can have a favorable impact on awarding admission and scholarships. The Advanced Placement Program examinations are administered in May. **The cost of each examination varies each year, and The Buffalo Public School District has covered the cost for students since 2018(this is subject to change). Students who take AP courses are required to take AP exams as part of our magnet school theme.** **Student Initial** **Parent Initial**

International Baccalaureate Courses

The IB Diploma Program is an academically challenging program of education to become active, compassionate, and life-long learners who are prepared for college and life beyond that prepares juniors and seniors in high school. The program is taught over two years and has gained recognition and respect from the world's leading universities.

All students at City Honors in grades 11 and 12 are either IB Course candidates or IB Diploma candidates. Course candidates take at least one two year IB course, English Literature. Diploma candidates study six courses, usually three at higher level (HL) and three at standard level (SL). Students must choose from several different subject areas which ensure a breadth of experience in languages, social studies, the experimental sciences and mathematics. **Students in IB courses are required to take the IB exams as part of our magnet school theme. The Buffalo Public Schools currently pays for the cost of these examinations as part of our Magnet Program.**

IB Diploma candidates must additionally complete three core requirements: 1) Theory of Knowledge, 2) The Extended Essay, and 3) Creativity, Action, Service (CAS) hours. The Extended Essay and CAS hours are completed outside the regular school day.
