This application must be completed for students who want to be considered for admission to Frederick Law Olmsted #156 (grades 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12) and/or City Honors School #195 (grades 5, 6, 7, 8, 9).

- The on-time application window is **Monday**, **September 23**, 2024 **Friday**, **November 8**, 2024. All applications must be completed and delivered to the above address **no later than 3:30 pm on Friday**, **November 8**, 2024.
- Parent/caregiver must complete and submit one application for each child taking the entrance examination.
- The admission test will be offered at City Honors School #195, 186 East North Street, Buffalo NY 14204. (Current BPS students in grades 4, 6, and 8 may take the admissions test at their home school).
- All students must be pre-registered for the test as there are limited seats.
- Students are permitted to complete one test per year according to the admissions testing schedule. The same test is used for admissions eligibility to both Frederick Law Olmsted #156 and City Honors School #195; students who complete the admissions testing will automatically be ranked for both schools.
- Parent/caregiver must update any address and/or telephone changes with Student Placement & Registration.
- School placement is conditional upon the student successfully passing their current grade as evidenced by the report card and/or transcript.
- Sibling, proximity, and neighborhood preference does not apply for Frederick Law Olmsted #156 nor City Honors #195
- Specialized programs for students with special educational or bilingual language needs may not be available.
- If a student is placed in a waiting pool for a particular school, the student will remain active until **Friday**, **October 24, 2025**.
- Non-BPS applicants (i.e., students who attend charter, parochial, private schools or are home schooled) must reside in the City of Buffalo and provide the following documents at the time of application submission. All documents will be verified by the Student Placement & Registration Office prior to receiving a testing date.
 - Student's Proof of Birth, i.e., birth certificate, passport, or government-issued ID or document –
 DOCUMENT SUBMITTED MUST LINK THE STUDENT TO THE PARENT
 - o Photo Identification of Parent/Caregiver
 - Copies of two (2) distinct proofs of City of Buffalo residency (choose 2 different proofs from the list of four (4) below showing your Buffalo address substitute proofs will *not* be accepted):
 - 1) Parent/caregiver NYS driver license or non-driver license
 - 2) Gas, electric, or cable bill within the last 30 days (only one utility bill can be used)
 - 3) Parent/caregiver pay stub with home address listed within the last 30 days
 - 4) Notice of Decision from the Erie County Department of Social Services (within the year of date not expired example: ECDSS Budget Sheet with the home address)
 - o Applicant's Final CUMULATIVE 2023-2024 report
 - o Applicant's Final CUMULATIVE 2023-2024 attendance record (may appear on the report card)
 - o Current IEP, 504 or English Language Learner (ELL) documents only if applicable

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

If a student lives in Buffalo but attends a school outside the BPS district, you must provide a letter from the student's current District of enrollment verifying the following information: School District, School Name, Last Name, First Name, Date of Birth, Current Address, Parent/Caregiver, and Dates of Attendance, as well as a printout from the school's Student Information System which list the basic demographic information and address. If this is not attached, the application will be voided. All letters will be verified by a Registration representative from the Office of Student Placement & Registration. Example: your child resides in the City of Buffalo; however, attend a school in the Cheektowaga School District, Williamsville School District or NYC School District.
