Parents and students are asked to **very carefully** read the rules of how we structure our dances and permission slip to avoid unpleasant surprises on dance night and to provide our students with a safe and enjoyable evening.

#### Middle School Sports

Parents: We continue to receive concerns about the elimination of middle school cross country for the fall in BPS and the elimination of most BPS middle school girls and boys basketball teams during the winter, including the CHS middle school basketball teams. CHS students will now need to travel to 'zone' locations if they want to play on a middle school basketball team.

Please understand that athletics in BPS is centrally coordinated by the school district. The decision to eliminate these programs was not a school-based decision. Our school strongly believes that accessible athletic opportunities for all students are critical to student development. Inquiries about the elimination of these sports should be directed to the Assistant Superintendent for Athletics or members of the Board of Education who govern such changes rather than contacting our school-based administrators.

#### **Traffic Safety Alert**

CHS Parents: Please do not attempt to drop your child off along East North Street in the mornings between Masten Ave and Fosdick Ave as this requires students to walk across the entrance to the faculty parking lot which is very dangerous. Parents should also never attempt to enter the faculty parking lot at arrival or dismissal. The East curb to Fosdick Street is the safest place to drop children off and pick them up. This does require patience but our children are worth it!

#### **CHS Grade Level Assessment Calendars**

Attention parents and students: Have you seen our Grade Level Assessment Calendar? Our teachers post important assessments (important quizzes, tests, projects, papers, IB internal assessments, etc.) on it to make sure parents know when assessments are taking place and to help students' stay

organized. Most importantly, it helps teachers to make sure students are not overloaded with assessments on a particular day. As an IB World School, City Honors is required to have a calendar for each grade level in the IB Middle Years Program (grades 5-10) and then for the Diploma Program (grades 11-12).
