Cardinal Craze Week is Here!!!

What is Cardinal Craze Week?

Each year, classes at our school spend 'Cardinal Craze Week' fiercely competing to win 'The Rock of Mount Pelion,' commonly known as 'The Rock.' Take a moment to read the mystical, mysterious and remarkable tale of how Cardinal Craze Week began <u>at this link</u>. The week takes its name from one of our two primary school colors, Cardinal Red.

What are the CHS Class Colors?

Every grade level has a class color that they use to represent their class in hallway decorating and on class color day:

White: 5* Yellow: 9
Purple: 6 Green: 10
Orange: 7 Blue: 11
Pink: 8 Red: 12

*Grade 5 students have white shirts so they can continue the time-honored tradition of tie-dying their shirts as a special activity with the senior class in the late spring. 5th graders should be sure to hold onto their class t-shirts after this week!

2002 Class Color T-shirts for Class Color Day are available for \$5.00 during all lunch periods all week. If your means allow, please consider paying more than \$5.00 to help provide shirts to students who might not otherwise be able to afford a shirt!

How Can You Earn Points to Help Your Class Win The Rock?

1. Dress Up For Each Theme Day

Homeroom teachers will record every student who dresses for the day and their grade level. See our theme days for the week <u>at this link</u> as set by the student theme day subcommittee.

2. Help Decorate Your Class Hallway

Each class has a set hallway to decorate. PE and Health teachers will bring each of their classes on 10/25 and 10/16 to decorate. This year, each class has been assigned a theme to decorate around, in addition to their class color. Students should be sure to carefully <u>read this document</u> before they begin any decorating!

- 3. Cheer your grade level's <u>'Dance-Off Team'</u> and <u>'Hype Video'</u> to victory at the Kick-off Assembly on Monday morning!
- **4. Help Others!** Each year the Cardinal Craze Week Charity Subcommittee works to be sure that we harness the energy of Centaur spirit to benefit others in our city who need our help! You can be a part of this in two ways:
- A. Donate non-perishable food items in homeroom to benefit the BFNC Fruitbelt Neighborhood Food Bank. Every non-perishable food item you bring in to homeroom, earns your class points toward winning The Rock!
- **B. Participate in the 'Penny War'.** This year the Cardinal Craze Week Charity Subcommittee has selected our very own <u>Pelion Outdoor Classroom</u> as the charitable recipient of all proceeds from the annual Penny War.

Here's how it works: Every grade level has a watercooler jug kept by the teachers listed below. **All coins** placed in the jug help your class acquire points. But here's the twist, **all paper money** placed in your class's jug, take away from your class points. If you are worried another class is acquiring too

A Note About Student Medications from BPS

Students should not carry medications with them on their persons, backpack, or locker at any time. This includes Tylenol, Motrin, and cough drops. The only exception to this rule is physician ordered inhalers, and epi-pens for allergic reactions, once the physician order is on file in the Clinic. Students whose physicians deem it necessary for the student to have medication in school must send a written order from the physician and parental permission along with the medication in a labeled container to the school clinic and administered as directed.

CHS Girls Swim Team Captures BPS Title

On Wednesday, October 17th the girls' varsity swim team won the title of All-High Champions, winning the BPS swim league. The team won 10 out of 11 of the swimming events with a final score of 524 points with Hutch Tech coming in second with a score of 271 points followed by Olmsted's third place finish of 171 points. COVID Boosters and Flu Shots


Please check with your family doctor to see if it is time for COVID booster shots in your family. It is also time for fall flu shots. Vaccinations help to:


CHS Connect Life Club Blood Drive
