See the CHS Chorale Perform in Evita at Shea's This Weekend!



Join us for dinner to celebrate the end of the growing season! **Friday, 4 NOV. 5:00-6:30pm** (rain date 5th of NOV 5-6:30pm)

You may remember that our 3 Sisters Island was under a tarp for most of COVID so we could reset the soil and reduce the bindweed (and other pesky plants). The current batch of 6th graders were responsible for starting the seeds of corn, beans, and squash then planting the companion mounds last spring. All summer (every day) we watered and watered and watered and watered and waaaat--so much watering. The result was glorious butternut squash, lovely Martian Jewel ears of corn, and several hundred pods of black eyed peas! 6th graders seemed very impressed with what they started. So, let's eat together!

We will have the camp stove setup for popping corn and simmering a HUGE pot of butternut squash soup! Please bring your favorite recipes featuring corn, beans, or squash. CHS Speech and Debate Opens the Season in Fine Form at Brighton

Your City Honors Speech and Debate team dominated in its first tournament of the season, placing 1st amongst 5 schools from the Buffalo-Rochester region on Saturday, 10/22 at the Brighton Invitational. In fact, 15 of our 16 competing students took home a medal in their respective categories.

In Speech, junior Annika Wilewicz placed 1st in Original Oratory, while senior captain Phoebe Lawton not only placed 1st in Oral Interpretation, but also is now half qualified for the NYS championship tournament this April!

In Lincoln Douglas Debate, sophomore and novice debaters Amber Fleahman and Geneieve Harris placed 1st and 2nd respectively. At the intermediate level, it was a clean sweep as Sali Salamata, Zaima Islam and Daniel Moka earned gold, silver and bronze. Our senior captains placed 1-2 at the varsity level, with Julia Chiriboga taking 1st and becoming half qualified for the state tournament and Ciah Courtney placing 2nd.

In Public Forum Debate, the freshmen team of Brian Caulfield and Jack Redwine took the silver medal, while the sophomore team of Sifat Ahmed and Arian Bhuiyan placed 1st in the novice level. At the intermediate level, juniors Tiahnee Porter and Madoka Aldstadt placed 1st and Nathan Lloyd and Aidan Becker placed 3rd. Finally, in Varsity PFD, Seniors Zach Biniszkievicz and Julia Eagan placed 3rd, while Senior Captains Liam Cobb and Jake Baldwin earned 2nd place, just narrowly missing out on a state half qual.

Congratulations to a great squad effort. The team was back in action this past Saturday, 10/29 at the Webster-Schroeder Invitational. We'll have a full run-down in the next issue.
