"Office Hours" are now "Centaur Support Time"





Centaurs of the CHS Speech and Debate Team Seek Perfection

The City Honors Speech and Debate Team continued their winning streak, remaining unbeaten on the season on 1/7 at the Rochester School of the Arts Invitational. With just one regular season tournament left on the schedule, your Centaurs are hoping for a perfect season!



Helping to secure the win in Speech categories were J. Bensch, Liam Rio and Tim Tidd, who placed 1st through 3rd, respectively in Dramatic Interpretation. With J. Bensch's gold medal, they are also now fully qualified to compete at the New York State tournament in April. In Varsity Oral Interpretation, Dani Peffer earned the bronze medal to add to their collection.

In the category of Lincoln Douglas debate, novice level, Rayhona Nasimjonova placed 1st in her very first tournament, while Genevieve Harris earned the silver medal. At the Varsity level, senior captain Julia Chiriboga placed 1st and is now fully qualified to compete at States! Max Riley Pasciak earned the bronze medal.

Public Forum debate featured the most competitors for CHS and they delivered spectacularly. In the novice level, it was a clean sweep as Hasan Jamil & Fahim took gold and qualified for States, Simon Fischer & Tristan Tortora placed 2nd, and Jack Redwine & Brian Caulfield earned 3rd place. In intermediate PFD, Aidan Becker & Nathan Lloyd placed 2nd, while Tiahnee Porter & Madoka Aldstadt placed 3rd. It was another clean sweep at the Varsity level, as Amelia and Charlotte Colder took home the gold medal and qualified for States, Jake Baldwin & Liam Cobb earned silver, and Julia Eagan & Zach Biniszkiewicz captured bronze.

Overall, 15 of our 20 competitors earned medals and nearly earned their 3rd perfect score of the season, narrowly missing that mark by just 2 points! The last regular season tournament is next Saturday, 1/28, just down the road at Mount Mercy Academy. Congratulations to a well earned team effort!
