On Thursday night, the CHS girls basketball team used teamwork and fierce determination to take sole possession of the BPS league lead by defeating Olmsted 47-21, avenging a loss earlier this season to the Owls. The Centaurs now have a 10-1 league record. Leading scorers for CHS were Ava Purks with 19, Molly Galvin 17 and Ariel Coleman with 7. In other news at Thursday night's game, the sophomores won Dr. Kresse's first-ever 'Big Game Challenge'. Dr. Kresse had offered the grade level with the greatest percentage of students present for Thursday night's basketball game versus Olmsted an all-expenses paid pizza party sometime during the month of March (exact date TBA).

All eight grades of Centaurs had students present at the game and made us proud as the results were very close, but we'll share the results of the top four finishers:

-In 4th place with 14.1% of their class present, the freshman.

-In 3rd place with 18.1% of their class present, the seniors. -In 2nd place, with 19.8% of their class present, the juniors. -In 1st place with 21.6% of their class present, the sophomores.

CHS Speech and Debate Stays Undefeated to Capture Another Regional Title

The City Honors Speech and Debate team finished its regular season UNDEFEATED by placing 1st at last Saturday's Mount Mercy Academy Invitational tournament! This is the second consecutive season the team has not lost a regional tournament by competing against 8 schools in the Buffalo-Rochester region.



In the category of Lincoln Douglas debate, sophomore Genevieve Harris won her first gold medal of the year, while Rayhona Nasimjonova took home the bronze. Juniors Madoka Aldstadt and Tiahnee



In the Speech division of Dramatic Interpretation, senior captain Liam Rio won the gold medal, while Faith Floyd earned the silver. Junior Forrest Denz placed 1st for the first time this season in Original Oratory. Finally, in Oral Interpretation, junior Dani Peffer took home the silver medal! Porter easily placed 1st in Intermediate Public Forum debate, while it was a clean sweep in the novice category. The duo of Sascha Westermann and Oscar Calipari placed 1st, Brian Caulfield and Jack Redwine earned 2nd place, and Simon Fisher and Tristan Tortora took 3rd.



Overall, 10 of our 15 competing students placed on the podium and earned medals for their performances. On February 4th, students will compete in the



Regional Qualifying Tournament for their last chance to earn a spot at the NYS tournament held in April!
