Electronic Payment for School Activities

We have some exciting news for CHS families- the Buffalo Public Schools are beginning to offer the option to make electronic payments for special school activities such as field trips, extra team gear, class dues, school bookstore items and tickets to special events etc. This system is called "SchoolCash" and it will allow families to make quick and easy electronic payments. Many other local school districts have been accepting electronic payments for years as a way to avoid students having to carry cash or checks to school and to eliminate the possibility of errors in these transactions. This system is being phased-in over the next year so not all activities may accept SchoolCash payments initially. However, if you want to be ready to use SchoolCash when the opportunity arises, your family must be registered in the system.
