CHS Foundation Updates*

- -The CHS Foundation recently donated an 86" flat screen and video conferencing equipment to our Large Group Instruction (LGI) at CHS to replace our previous interactive screen which was no longer working. This new screen should improve the quality of the viewing experience and remote conferencing in the LGI. The Foundation is working on additional steps to spruce up the appearance and acoustics of the LGI that should be completed toward the end of the school year.
