Remember- the idea of these exams is not for our students to be perfect! Even if our students do not attain college credits through these exams, research has demonstrated they will be better able to navigate college through exposure to these courses and exams. In addition, colleges are impressed when they take risks like enrolling in IB and AP courses. All exams are paid for by the Buffalo Public Schools. Students do not need to pay for them as they do in most American schools. Students are asked to simply give their best effort to prepare and on exam day. The rest will take care of itself!

Give Your Eclipse Glasses a Second Chance to Shine!

CHS is teaming up with 'UB Sustainability' and 'Astronomers Without Borders' to provide solar eclipse glasses recycling.

Instead of throwing your glasses away, have your child bring them to CHS and drop them off in the collection box outside the main office. Collection continues through April 30.

Since 2008, Astronomers Without Borders has been collecting solar glasses used for viewing annular and total solar eclipse across the globe and sending them to communities across Africa, Asia, and North and South America that do not have access to these glasses that would allow individuals to safely watch an eclipse.

Grade 5-8 NYS Assessments

NYS Assessments are being administered throughout the month of April to students in grades 5-8. A lot has changed about these assessments again this year. They are shorter than they used to be and grade levels take them on scattered dates throughout the month rather than all on the same day. Also new this year, our students are taking about half of their assessments online (this is why BPS IT department collected devices from middle school students right before break so they could be sure they were ready to go).

These assessments have not been linked to teacher or administrator evaluations for many years now. They are a diagnostic to determine where we can do a better job as a school teaching our students and where individual students need support. Teachers have been directed by Dr. Kresse not to assign homework the night before assessments. Students are asked to simply give their best effort to demonstrate the skills they have learned from their teachers.

Algebra 2 tutoring continues during all lunch periods EVERY Tuesday. Sign-up by dropping by the school counseling office!


Remember: All Courier College Prep sessions are completely free of charge and open to all students. Funding is provided through the BPS Community Schools Program (CSP)

Autism Awareness Factoids

Each day during 'Autism Awareness Spirit Week' at CHS right before the break, our students listened to special morning PA announcements brought to them by students in the CHS STARS program to help their classmates understand more about Autism. Please take a moment to read these announcements to increase adult understanding in our community:

3/25 Announcement

World Autism Awareness Day is observed every year on April 2. It was established by the United Nations General Assembly in 2007 as a day to recognize and spread awareness for the rights of people with autism. Autism spectrum disorder, or ASD, is a developmental disability caused by differences in the brain. People with ASD may have different ways of learning, moving, communicating, or paying attention. The STARS program here at CHS is comprised of students with autism in grade 5-12 and makes up about 12% of our student body. We believe these students contribute to the diversity of our school and make CHS a better place every day!

3/26 Announcement

The term "neurodivergent" describes people whose brain differences affect how they function. It was first coined by sociologist Judy Singer, an autistic person herself, in 1997. Autistic or allistic people may identify as neurodivergent depending on their preferences. Like a person's fingerprints, no two brains are exactly the same. The concept of neurodiversity recognizes and celebrates the wide range of how humans interact with the world.

3/27 Announcement

While a lot of research has been done on autism over the years, there remain many misconceptions. Here are the most common myths and the actual facts.

MYTH: Vaccines cause autism. FACT: The safety of vaccines has been tested across many groups of people. Research has shown that vaccinations do not cause autism.

MYTH: Only boys have autism. FACT: Girls are more likely to 'mask' their autism, learning the skills to interact with the world better than boys. This can mean that many autistic girls get a diagnosis much later in life.

MYTH: Autistic people are anti-social. FACT: People with autism may interact with the world around them differently, but they still enjoy having relationships and getting to know people.

Thanks to all who supported the STARS program during this year's Autism Acceptance Week. To wrap up, here is some information about how to help neurodiverse and autistic people.

Get to know us. Autism is not a "one size fits all" diagnosis. Don't be afraid to ask your friends what you can do to help them.

Steer clear of assumptions. Just because someone's brain works a bit differently doesn't mean they should be judged. Remember: every neurodivergent person is different, and you don't know what it's like to be in their shoes.

Above all else, strive to be encouraging and compassionate. Being aware is the first step towards acceptance of all people to build a more inclusive society!

2024-25 CHS School-Based Budget

Each spring, BPS allocates staffing and supply funds to each school for the upcoming school year.

Schools must budget within that allocation. Over the past month, Dr. Kresse has presented the proposed budget at meetings of the Site Based Management Team, Building Committee, PTSCO, the CHS Foundation and to the CHS Faculty. Due to reduced allocations experienced by all buildings in the district, as well as some staffing costs unique to our building, there are required reductions for the upcoming school year. Although the school principal must submit a proposed budget to the school district this week, there is a possibility for the budget to change later this spring depending on the final New York State budget and other variables. All School Based Budget documents and information have been posted at the bottom of the Family Resources section of our school website.
