# 2024-25 CHS School-Based Budget

Each spring, BPS allocates staffing and supply funds to each school for the upcoming school year. Schools must budget within that allocation. Over the past month, Dr. Kresse has presented the proposed budget at meetings of the Site Based Management Team, Building Committee, PTSCO, the CHS Foundation and to the CHS Faculty. Due to reduced allocations experienced by all buildings in the district, as well as some staffing costs unique to our building, there are required reductions for the upcoming school year. Although the school principal must submit a proposed budget to the school district this week, there is a possibility for the budget to change later this spring depending on the final New York State budget and other variables. All School Based Budget documents and information have been posted at the bottom of the Family Resources section of our school website.
