AP/IB Exams

IB and AP exams start begin this Friday, April 28th. All students in grades 10-12 are expected to attend all classes when not taking an examination. **Unlike Regents testing, classes ARE being held during examinations and students must attend school all exam days.**

Students and parents should BE SURE they know when exams are (date and time). The exam schedule can be viewed <u>at this link</u>.

Seniors will begin the Senior Service Learning Initiative (SLI) starting on Monday, May 15th, but are to come to school for all classes and examinations until that date. After that date, unless a previous arrangement has been made with their teacher, they are expected to continue to go to classes where the exam has not yet taken place.

For AP and IB examinations, students should report to the auditorium, ready to go, no later than 15 minutes before the scheduled examination time.
