Seal of Biliteracy: A Record-Breaking Year for City Honors!

After several months of hard work, **46 Centaurs** have earned the NYS Seal of Biliteracy in English and either Chinese, French, or Spanish. These students proved their proficiency in English and their chosen language by maintaining high course averages in their English and World Language classes in 11th and 12 grades, and by earning top scores on their ELA exams. Their final task was to complete a research-based project and present it to a panel of teachers in their World Language. Our Centaurs did such outstanding work that even a representative from the NYSED Office of Bilingual Education

and World Languages was impressed! 
