Regents Exams Continue This Week

Regents Exams have been held since 1865, providing students in New York State with the opportunity to prove their skills to colleges and scholarship officers as well as to validate that their diplomas meet an objective higher standard than just class grades. Students are encouraged to get a good night's rest before all exams and a full & healthy breakfast. Please review all dates and times at this link to be sure your child arrives on-time to all remaining exams. Morning exams report at 8:00 AM, Afternoon Exams Report at Noon.

Is Your Child Leaving Us?

If your child will not be attending City Honors next school year, it is critical at this point that you contact your child's CHS school counselor as soon as your plans are confirmed. Your child's transfer to another school is not complete in eyes of the New York State Education Department until you have notified our school in writing that you are withdrawing your child and provided confirmation of enrollment in their new school. New CHS Bell Schedule

In May of this year, the BPS Board of Education voted to place City Honors in "Tier 2" of the new BPS bell schedule system. This has resulted in the start and end to our school day being pushed back a bit. All parents and students should become familiar with the new bell schedule <u>at this link</u>. Here are some answers to frequently asked questions about our new bell schedule:

Q: Will shelter and supervision still continue to be provided before and after the start of the school day for families who want to avoid AM and PM congestion?

A: Yes! We know this is important to families. We will add the exact times to the schedule this summer as soon as we confirm them with affected labor partners.

Q: Will high school music ensembles continue to meet prior to the start of the school day?

A: Yes, high school ensembles will need to continue to meet prior to the school day. Moving the ensembles into the school day would requires that our bell schedule add "folding lunch periods" into the school day and an extra period added. In order to achieve this, we would need approval from the Buffalo Teacher Federation and would need to complete an extensive process to be sure that our staffing can support an extra period in the school day. Our administrative team plans to explore this with the teacher members of the Building Committee this year, but it cannot be ready for the fall of '23.

Q: Why was a minute added to passing time for students?

A: Our school building is a very large complex. Some students must make their way from one end of the building to the other or up several floors between classes in just four minutes. Our hope is that adding a minute to passing time will reduce the number of students who are tardy to class and provide time for students to use the restroom so they do not need to leave class to do so. We will carefully monitor tardy rates in our student information system next school year to see if this adjustment has had a positive impact.

CHS Track & Field Runs Wild at the Class A Championships

On Saturday May 27th, members of the City Honors Track and field team participated in the Class A Championship meet at Williamsville South.

Henry Peterson and Felix Hatton finished 1st and 2nd in the 3200m respectively, with Felix setting a PR in the process. He also set a new personal record in the 1600m and earned a qualifying time for Sectionals. Sharmu Puang ran a personal best in the 110 hurdles which also qualified him to run at Sectionals.

The boys 4x400m relay team with member Andrew Worley, Vurabari Bagia, Forrest Denz and Elijah Donlon, set a new school record of 3:48s, also earning a chance to compete in Sectionals.

On the girls side, Uma Bhattacharjee won the 200m and finished 3rd in the 100m. Brynne Walentynowicz had great performances in the 100 and 400 hurdles.

Both Uma and Brynne also ran in the 4x100m relay along with Zoe Mcfoy and Olivia Brooks, tying a school record. All the girls earned qualifying times for sectionals for their performances in their events.

Instrumental Camp - July 24-28, 2023



Vocal Camp - July 24-28, 2023


