## **Start of School: Tuesday, September 8!**

- -Tuesday, September 8 will be a full day of classes for all CHS students. Instruction will be 100% remote for at least the first 4-6 weeks of school. The Board of Education will reassess things at that time.
- -All classes will be 'synchronous' the first time a student has them in their schedule, even if they are noted to be asynchronous on the synch/asynch charts that apply to your child's grade level.
- -There will be no homeroom period for students in grade 7-12 until further notice. Students will begin their first period class at 8:21am. For grade 5/6 students, the asynch period window at the start of the school day will not be used during the first day of school. Grade 5/6 students should report to their first period block at 8:40am.
- -Students are expected to attend all classes remotely and follow the CHS daily bell schedule which is printed on the schedule mailed home to them and available in the Infinite Campus student/parent portal. Students must be engaged in assigned practice or small group work with their teachers during asynchronous periods. Teachers will monitor student participation and will be available via their Teams class links during asynch periods.
- -Teachers will take attendance in all periods whether synch or asynch.
- -CHS Consumable and textbook distribution days will be the Week of September 14 in order to account in delays in vendor shipping. Please stay tuned for an upcoming email with the exact day and time for your family to pick-up materials.
- -All families are asked to be sure to watch the video trainings and read the documents at the 2020 CHS Back-to-School Information Menu in the Parent Resources section of the CHS website: <a href="https://cityhonors.org/families/resources/">https://cityhonors.org/families/resources/</a> Your child will not be able to participate in their classes and understand their schedule without this critical information.

### **Laptop Computers and Schoology**

- -If your child has not been using their BPS laptop over the summer, please be sure they charge it this weekend and start it up to be sure it is functioning properly. They should also login to Schoology this weekend to be sure their sign-on works and to view messages from Dr. Kresse in their "recent activity feed". **They will need to login in to Schoology to access all of their remote classes.**
- -Is your child new to Schoology? Encourage them to watch BPS Schoology training videos at: <a href="https://www.buffaloschools.org/page/88626">https://www.buffaloschools.org/page/88626</a> so they will know how to login and navigate within Schoology. If they are new to the district and have not been issued a Schoology password, they should email schoologyadmin@buffaloschools.org as soon as possible or call the BPS technology helpline at 816.7100.
- -Any remaining families still needing a BPS laptop device should come on September 8-11th, 10 am-4 pm to 1515 South Park Avenue, 14220. All laptop distribution is centralized. The school does not have any laptops or hotspots at the school.
- -Does your child have a BPS laptop and is getting 'license expiring' messages? Here is a neat little 'hack': you can go to any BPS school, get close enough to the building to pick up the WiFi, and then restart the machine and let it finish starting up and downloading any updates.
- -Your child does not need the Microsoft Teams App on their laptop to access their classes. They can just click on the Teams link in each of the Schoology courses and it will open up Teams and their remote class. The district is working on a system to remotely add the Teams App to district laptops.

#### **Congratulations Sam and Liam!**

Sam Farrell '21 and Liam Dell '21 have been named Semi-finalists in the National Merit Scholarship Competition. Out approximately 1.5 million seniors in the United States, US territories and US military installations, 16,000 students have been named semifinalists in this competition based on their performance on the PSAT taken during their junior year of high school. Good luck to both these Centaurs as they move on to be reviewed for spots as finalists in the competition.

The Buffalo Public Schools traditionally fund all students in the district to take the PSAT during grade 10 and grade 11. The grade 11 PSAT serves as the National Merit Qualifying Test. The CHS School Counselors will send an update explaining how and when the PSAT will be administered this year to all grade 10 and 11 families as soon as we receive news.

#### **Information From the CHS School Counseling Department**

- -Our school counselors have set up special groups in Schoology for the CHS Classes of 2021, 2022, and 2023. Please encourage your child to keep an eye out for important information from the counselors including college admissions tips every Tuesday and Thursday.
- -The school counseling office is working with college and university admissions representatives to set up virtual visits with groups of our juniors and seniors. Information about how to access these visits and a schedule of schools conducting the visits will be shared shortly.
- -Each year CHS school counselors consider the schedule adjustment requests of students who believe
- they have a gap in their schedule, OR
- they may have been incorrectly placed in a course, OR
- they are missing a requested and required course, based upon those courses the student requested last year.

Class change requests based upon teacher or time preference cannot be considered due to the need to preserve class size limits and balancing. If a schedule change request is honored, students will see those changes in the Infinite Campus Student and/or Parent Portal when they have been made. ## **Change of Family Information**

Have you moved to a new address? Have you changed your cell/phone number? Do you want to update who can and cannot pick up your child in the event of an emergency? Then you must update your child's contact information. Please visit ,https://www.buffaloschools.org/contact to complete the form.

If your child takes the bus, you will want to update this information as soon as possible because the transportation department will need updated information to pick up and drop off your child at the correct location.

If you are changing your home address, you will need to provide proof of residence. You can take a picture and upload your driver's license, utility bill, voter registration card, mortgage statement, decision letter from Dept. of Social Services, rental receipt, OR signed lease.
